Students Need Adults Who Care

A couple of weeks ago I received a newspaper article titled, "Students need adults who care enough to learn their name" by Joe Ball. The article discusses that "teenagers need at least five adults in their lives who know their names, their hopes and dreams." The author goes on to say how awesome it would be if each student in our church had an adult who treated them like family.

One of our goals in the student ministry of FBCW is to connect all ages of the church together. In order to meet this goal, we need YOU. Yes, YOU. To make a difference in a student's life today, personal relationships are the key. We need everyone within our church family to be involved in one or two (or more) student's lives.

What does this mean? How do we fulfill this task within our busy lives? First, choose to make a difference. Take a student to lunch after church. Invite them to dinner. When you are doing something that you enjoy, find a student that enjoys that too. Don't fall into the trap of thinking I don't have time or I am too old. A dear friend of mine, Sherry, turned 70 this year. She had a moment earlier this year where she thought she was done working with teens and possibly even working for the Lord. Then one day, while studying Scripture, God gave her the following guidance from Psalm 92:12-15.

The righteous will flourish like a palm tree, they will grow like a cedar of Lebanon; planted in the house of the LORD, they will flourish in the courts of our God. They will still bear fruit in old age, they will stay fresh and green, proclaiming, "The Lord is upright; he is my Rock, and there is no wickedness in him."

After reading this Scripture, Sherry recognized that God was not done with her. She still had a lot of "fruit" to give. Since this time, she has chaperoned youth camp, zip -lined with her grandson and other youth at camp, and is currently teaching un-churched youth the Bible.

In 2015, the student ministry at FBCW will be doing quite a lot of weekend retreats and a variety of other activities where YOU can be involved. Or YOU can decide to be involved in a more personal way by getting to know a student well and by treating them like they are a member of your family.

The article from Joe Ball was passed on to me by one of our "older" church members who realizes that teens need people like her to be involved in their lives in order for the church to make a difference in the teen's lives. She has chosen to act when she sees a need. It is a blessing to see how the students respond to her. It has been life changing for at least one of the students already, and I expect it will be for others as well.
