

In-Person Worship - What You Can Expect

We are very excited to resume in-person worship gatherings. With that said, this is a time to proceed with caution, so if you are in the riskiest categories or if you feel uneasy about returning at this point, we encourage you to participate via our online offerings. The following precautions have been developed by the staff and deacons in consultation with health officials and with other religious organizations.

Precautions

- At first, we will only resume Sunday morning worship.
- There will be no Adult Choir and Praise First will model distancing.
- We encourage all worshipers to wear masks. (We will have masks available.)
- We encourage you to arrive early for worship and enter by the doors at the back of the Sanctuary or by the door at the top of the ramp.
- We will suspend our 'Meet and Greet' during the service.
- A box will be available for tithes and offerings. You may also give online or mail contributions to the church.
- Social Distancing will be modeled on the platform.
- Every other pew will be blocked off.
- Families will be encouraged to sit together.
- All others should be 6 feet apart.
- Please observe one person at a time in the restrooms.
- At first we will not provide nursery care or children's church, but we will provide additional children's worship materials and we will dedicate a portion of the worship time for the children.
- Bulletins will not be handed out but will be set out on a table for worshipers who would like to have them.

First Baptist Welcomes Guest Speaker Travis Allen Freeman



Dr. Travis A. Freeman is a 1999 graduate of Corbin High School, where he was a top ten student and four-year letterman for the Redhound football team. After losing his sight at the age of twelve due to a severe infection, Travis played backup center for the Redhounds from 1995-1998, as "America's First Blind Football Player." In 1999, the National High School Athletic Hall of Fame awarded Travis the first annual Travis Freeman Achievement Award, recognizing his achievements on the football field.

After high school, Travis attended the University of Kentucky, where he served as a football equipment manager and president of the "Fellowship of Christian Athletes." In 2003, Travis graduated from UK with a B.B.A. degree in Business Management. From UK, Travis went on to the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, where he earned a Master of Divinity degree and Doctorate of Philosophy (Ph.D.).

Travis teaches in the Missions and Ministry Department at University of the Cumberlands. He also serves as President and CEO of The Freeman Foundation, a non-profit organization, dedicated to promoting the truth that "disability does not equal inability." Travis and his wife, Stephanie, were married on July 25, 2015, and they welcomed their first child, Lillian Pearl, on January 3, 2019.

The major motion picture 23 *BLAST*, a feature film "loosely based" on Travis as a blind high school football player, was released in theaters on October 24, 2014, and is now available on DVD. Also, the book *Lights Out: Living in a Sightless World*, was released in October 2014. *Lights Out* is the complete story of Travis Freeman that inspired 23 *BLAST*.
